The 'Third Age' comes from a French idea, where the First Age is your childhood and education, the Second Age is your working life and bringing up children and the Third Age is where you make the most of your leisure time, have fun and help others.

Fleet U3A was formed in 1994 and we have grown into one of the largest U3As in the country. We are all volunteers. We share our knowledge and expertise with fellow members in the certain knowledge that we will benefit from others' skills and experience in other fields. Let us know if you have a skill you would like to share or an interest you would like to develop with like-minded people.

Most groups meet in the daytime during the working week. We mostly keep to school terms. During the Covid-19 pandemic our programme of physical meetings and events was suspended although most groups continued to meet regularly in the virtual world. When you attend your first meeting, you must show the Group Leader your current membership card. It is recommended that both sides be completed to show ICE (in case of emergency) details. 
